



Inkless Rejuvenation / Brazilian Camouflage Contraindications

- ❖ Puberty -Should wait until at least 19 years of age.
- ❖ Stretch marks are still new and pink. Stretch marks need to be at least 2 years old.
- ❖ Anyone who is pregnant or nursing
- ❖ Anyone with cancer
- ❖ Anyone undergoing chemotherapy or radiation
- ❖ Anyone with an “active” infection of any type (Viral, Fungal or bacterial)
- ❖ Anyone with HIV or Hepatitis or any other transmittable blood conditions
- ❖ Anyone on Accutane (must be off of it for at least 12 months)
- ❖ Use of certain medications - retinoids or topical steroids (prescription or over-the-counter) makes the skin thinner and more fragile and increases the risk of scarring.
- ❖ Uncontrolled diabetes
- ❖ Keloid scarring prone
- ❖ Severe Hyperpigmentation
- ❖ Fillers/Botox in the treatment area
- ❖ Laser or RF treatment -Peels -Microneedling - or other treatments, in the area 4 weeks prior to treatment
- ❖ Although smoking is not a direct contraindication, we do not recommend it. Smoking decreases blood flow and inhibits proper healing and prolongs the healing period slowing down cell regeneration, and increasing the risk of infection. Smoking reduces collagen production in the body - which is what makes the skin more elastic. If your skin elasticity is reduced, your ink has a high chance of bleeding out.

Clients with any of the following conditions require doctors approval:

- ❖ Hemophilia/ other bleeding disorders
- ❖ Cardiac disease/abnormalities
- ❖ Uncontrolled high blood pressure
- ❖ Telangiectasia/erythema
- ❖ Collagen Vascular Disease
- ❖ Immune Disorders
- ❖ Micro-dose of Accutane
- ❖ Chronic Skin conditions eg: eczema
- ❖ Controlled Diabetes: healing could be compromised, and take a longer time. Additional precautions should be taken. Higher risk for infection, brown pigments may turn greyish and the pigment/ink retention can be poor.
- ❖ Poor general health - Anyone suffering from either a short-term illness or a long-term condition should consult a physician.
